

Initial Notification of Works: Crawley Junctions 8, 9 & 14 Improvement Scheme

Dear Resident / Stakeholder,

We are writing to let you know that Breheny Civil Engineering will shortly be starting work on the Crawley Junctions 8, 9 & 14 Improvement Scheme, on behalf of West Sussex County Council.

The scheme is a follow-on to Breheny's ongoing improvement works at M23 Junction 10 and forms part of the wider programme of highway improvements associated with the North East Sector of Crawley.

I am Emma Bates, the Public Liaison Officer for the scheme, and I will be your main point of contact throughout the works. My role is to keep local residents, businesses and stakeholders informed and to help with any questions or concerns you may have.

Why are the works required?

The scheme will include a range of improvements to the road network around Crawley Junctions 8, 9 and 14, including:

- Improvements to junction approaches and slip roads
- Carriageway widening and new road construction
- New and improved pedestrian facilities
- Improvements to drainage
- New and upgraded traffic signals and street lighting
- New signage, safety barriers and other highway features
- Resurfacing, road markings and landscaping

The works will be delivered in a number of phases, with traffic management arrangements changing as construction progresses.

When will the works take place?

Works are expected to **start towards the end of September 2026** and are currently programmed to continue until **the end of August 2027**.

How will the works affect traffic?

We understand that highway works can be disruptive, particularly around busy junctions, so the construction programme has been planned to minimise the impact on road users wherever possible.

Much of the work will be carried out offline, away from live traffic, which means we can complete a significant proportion of the construction without the need to close existing traffic lanes.

However, some lane closures, slip-road closures and full road closures will be required at certain stages. Some activities, including elements of the drainage works and final surfacing, are planned to take place at night to help minimise disruption during the day.

Where closures are required, signed diversion routes will be provided. Please follow the signed diversion route and allow additional time for your journey.
